First came the highly successful **'Its a Knockout'** weekend, August 17th and 18th. Despite the appalling weather, it rained for most of the whole weekend, the event proved a winner with both young and old. It also brought the crowds in from far and wide.

Saturday saw the Junior event taking place. 15 teams competed in a variety of games and the winners were



Silloth Junior School and Silloth Junior Football Club.

On Sunday the weather and the grudge matches got worse when it was the turn of the adults! 22 teams took part in a hard fought series of games with the eventual winners being Silloth Fire Brigade.

The organisers are already planning for next year's event!

One week later and it was the turn of the **Annual Town Carnival** on Bank Holiday Monday, but this time, thank

goodness, the rain stayed away. The event was sadly marred by the recent Foot and Mouth outbreak, which meant that many of the usual competitors stayed away.



The events included the ever popular Cumberland and Westmoreland Wrestling, a Spitfire aerobatics display, Lifeboat demonstration, plus numerous stalls and exhibitions on the green. Again the crowds came, proving this event as popular as ever. Next years Carnival is already being organised!

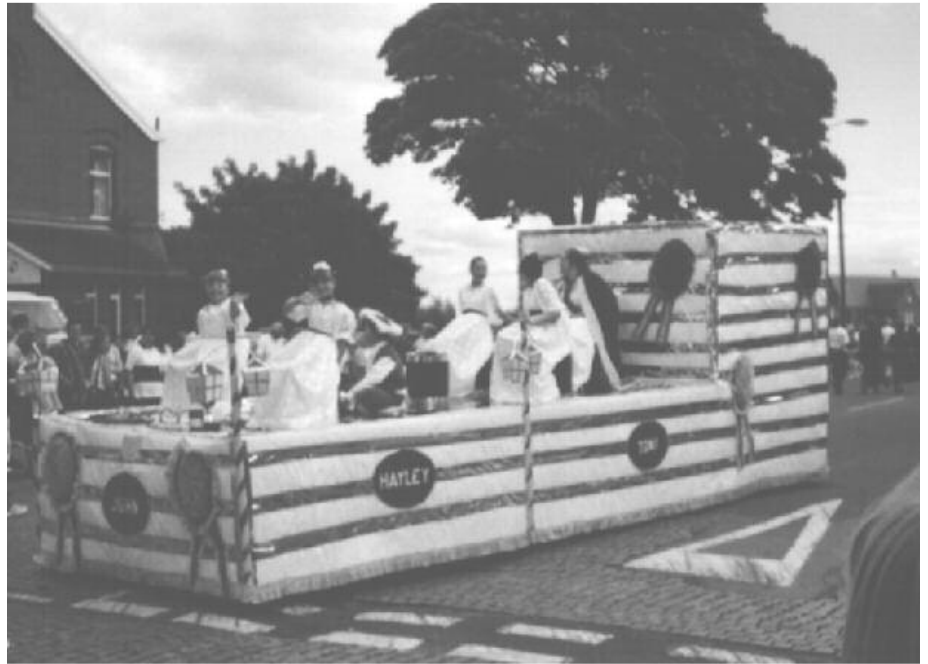

SILLOTH COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT CENTRE Silloth Primary School

As a recent convert to the technological age, having just bought a computer and still not sure how to switch it on! I decided it was time for me to consult the professionals, so I visited the Silloth Development Centre to find out which courses they had on offer.

The Centre opened in 1999, and is now in its third year of operation. Former pupils, Diane Graham, Manager and Community Tutor, and new recruit Andrea Stanwix,

Administrator, run the centre along with help from Tutors, John Hornsby and Sadie Haley, and Community Tutor, Tommy Akitt.

There are 12 Computers on site to be used by those attending taking courses at the Centre. These courses include emailing, Internet, publishing etc (a full list appears at the bottom of the page), and pupils include both young and old, with the oldest in their 80's.

There are limited free childcare places available and 4 local childminders in the town are used.

Coffee mornings are held every Wednesday morning, 9 a.m. - 12 noon, and is open to everyone, giving them the chance to discuss possible courses and to try out the computers. There is a charge of £2 per person but students are free.

Plans are at present being made to extend the facility so that it will include a conference centre and a main entrance directly into the centre, at present access is only available through the school.

Earlier this year the Centre organised a Ladies Night in the Balmoral, with all proceeds going to the Macmillan Fund. With the help of Chichester Hall, who provided the buffet, a total of £746, was raised.

Grants will not normally be awarded for work already carried out. Organisations will be invited to send a representative to the grants meeting.

Grants Meetings are held twice a year by a panel made up of representatives from County, Borough, Town and Parish Councils

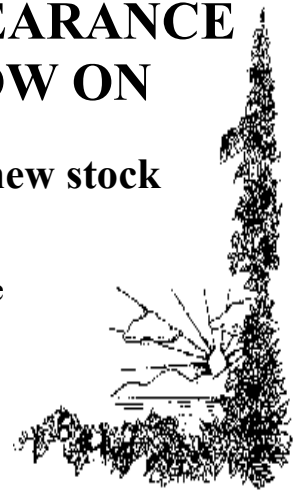
