# **New Silloth Post Office**

Silloth is soon to see the return of the Post Office and Royal Mail sorting office to the site they occupied almost a century ago.

In 1904 Mr J.J. Martin built what is now Winters Newsagents to house the sale of gifts and toys, as it does today, and to continue his position as sub postmaster of Silloth. The Post Office continued there until about 1908 when Mr Martin's son took over the business.



Many who have been in Winters Newsagents over the last couple of weeks will be aware of the changes that are taking place. With the Post Office due to be up and running from its new location by 27th June, there has been much to do.

The Post Office counter will be situated at the rear of the shop where alterations have been made to provide more space. Mr Ed Winter has confirmed that they will continue to supply all their current retail



products such as gifts, toys, stationery and confectionery and will continue to provide a delivery service of newspapers and magazines. He sees the inclusion of the Post Office to the premises as complementing the shops current standing in the town.

Mr Ed Winter has been appointed as sub postmaster and Mrs Chrissie Batey with Mrs Beryl Wallace will continue their employment from the new site. The Royal Mail staff and business are also being relocated to Winters with the sorting room being housed on the premises.

Winters will continue with its normal opening hours of 5am to 5:30pm, seven days a week. The Post Office counter will be open 9am to 5:30pm, Monday to Friday and 9am to 12:30pm on Saturdays.

As a local family business both Ed and his son Gary, are delighted to be able to provide the Post Office service for the people of Silloth, many will be relieved to know that the future of the Post Office provision has been secured after such a long period of uncertainty.
