Internet Access in Silloth & Abbeytown

I immediately received two emails extolling the virtues of the Library service.

At Silloth Library there are a number of PC's all with internet access which are available for public use. Several more are going to be installed shortly. Users are usually asked if they would like to become library members.

The normal charge is £2 per hour although there are concessions for library members who are unemployed, over 60, under 19, full time students or disabled, of up to an hour a day free of charge.

I believe there are similar facilities available, or shortly will be available in Abbeytown.

Whilst the staff will help where they can, users need to know the basics before coming to the library, as it is not possible to provide training for everyone.

There are other facilities available locally for anyone who requires training.
