October was quite a busy month with eight vessels entering the port.

There were two cargo's of wheat from Seaforth Grain Terminal, Liverpool, at the beginning of the month by the BEN ELLAN and at the end of the month by the BEN MAYE.

The large Russian vessel VASILYI SHUKSHIN brought a cargo of fertilizer from St. Petersburg on the 10th.

This was followed by the tanker ORATANK with a cargo of molasses from Amsterdam.

The next vessel was the LAURA-C ex-VIBRENCE with a cargo of wheat from Bonnières in France. The HEIDBURG followed with a cargo of fertilizer from Sfax in Tunisia.

A second tanker the WEST STREAM brought another cargo of molasses and finally the Irish flagged ship the ARKLOW MOOR brought a cargo of fertilizer from Ireland before sailing down to Workington to load rails.

The completion of the new molasses tanks has prompted comments on the great improvement to the area. The official opening of the molasses tanks took place on the 24th and was extremely well attended by port authority members and the business community.
