## **BUMPER CARGO SETS NEW RECORD AT PORT OF SILLOTH**

The single-largest consignment of cargo ever handled at the Port of Silloth - 3,311 tonnes of agribulks for Carr's fertiliser plant at Silloth - was recently discharged at the port from the 2,416 tonne m.v. Heljo. The previous record at the port, which is owned and operated by Associated British Ports (ABP), was a 3,282-tonne consignment of cement clinker shipped to Northern Ireland in 1987.

Steven Young, Port Manager, ABP Barrow & Silloth, said: "This proves that Silloth can comfortably handle vessels of over 3,000 deadweight tonnage. Records are set to be broken, and we are pleased to have set a new 'personal best' for Silloth - an ideal port-of-call for customers seeking to ship goods close to end-users in North-West England. We will continue to raise the standard in years to come."
