Cumbria Needs Firefighters

Cumbria County Council's Fire and Rescue Service is launching a new recruitment drive to find additional on-call firefighters to serve their communities.

On-call firefighters are needed to join crews at 32 fire stations across the county.

Cumbria Fire and Rescue Service (CFRS) is recruiting on-call firefighters needed at the following stations:

West - Workington, Whitehaven, Aspatria, Cockermouth, Egremont, Maryport, Seascale, Silloth and Wigton.

South - Barrow, Bootle, Broughton, Coniston, Millom, Ulverston, Walney, Kendal,

Ambleside, Appleby, Arnside, Kirkby Lonsdale, Kirkby Stephen, Milnthorpe, Sedbergh, Shap, Staveley and Windermere.

East - Alston, Brampton, Lazonby, Longtown and Patterdale

Cumbria Fire and Rescue Service is looking for men and women from all walks of life and all ages who can work as part of a team and are prepared to commit to the role. Qualifications aren't necessary, applicants must be at least 18 when their contract starts and be physically and medically fit.

On-call or retained firefighters are 'on call' to respond to a range of emergencies. They can still have another job until the call comes, then they become a professional firefighter. Call-out rates and workloads vary across the stations.

To apply people will need to complete an application form, carry out nationally recognised fitness and practical tests, and complete an interview and medical check.

Cumbria's Chief Fire Officer, Steve Healey said: "On-call firefighters play a crucial role in our communities and are called upon to attend the full range of incidents, from fires and floods, to road traffic collisions and chemical spills. I would urge people living and working in the areas where we're recruiting to consider applying to become part of the Cumbria Fire and Rescue Service team."

Cllr Janet Willis, Cumbria County Council's Cabinet Member for Fire and Rescue, said: "On-call Firefighters are an integral part of our service and community. We are keen to encourage anyone who thinks they may have the right skills to find out what they can offer - and in return, what we can offer you."

On-call Firefighters come from every walk of life, including homemakers, shopkeepers, builders, farmers, office workers and directors of companies, together with people who are not currently employed. Full training is provided on an ongoing basis, therefore previous experience is not needed.

An on-call Firefighter could be called out two or three times a week, for a few hours at a time but at some quieter fire stations they may only be called once or twice each month. The on-call hours are based around people's availability and other commitments.

To be an On-call Firefighter, you must:

Have a strong desire to support the local community.

Be enthusiastic about working as part of a team.

Have a reasonable level of personal fitness.

Live or/and work within 5 minutes of your local fire station. Cumbria currently has approx. 370 on call firefighters based all over the county.



Chimney Fire Safety Awareness

Cumbria Fire and Rescue Service (CFRS) is calling for improved chimney fire safety awareness following recent incidents involving chimney fires in the county.

Chimney fires
in England typically
account for over 4,000
incidents dealt with by
fire and rescue services
each year. CFRS is
calling on homeowners
to clean up their act
and get their chimneys
swept by an approved
sweep to prevent
chimney damage, and, in worse
cases, household fires.

Ed Burrows, Watch Manager for Prevention at Cumbria Fire and Rescue Service, says there are steps homeowners can take to prevent and protect their property: "To keep you and your family safe from fire you should make sure you have your chimney swept regularly, depending on what fuel you burn, before the colder months set in and you begin to use your fire again. To make the most of your wood burning stove, ensure you are using quality wood fuel, maintain your appliance and chimney regularly and check you are using your

appliance in accordance with the manufacturers' instructions.

The HETAS website has a range of useful tips to help you get the best performance from your stove.

People wouldn't think twice about getting their car MOT'd, but home appliances often get neglected. It might not be on the top of everyone's to-do lists, but you really can't afford to risk leaving these things unattended."

Ed also stresses the importance for homes to have carbon monoxide detectors fitted for those that have open fires, wood burning stoves and gas appliances.

"Carbon monoxide is known as the silent killer, you can't see it, you can't taste it, but it is a killer if left undetected. Please do purchase a CO alarm to keep your loved ones safe. Many detectors are now available for less than £10."



The community barbecue and fun day was held in Christ Church and in the grounds on Saturday 7th September to coincide with the Beer Festival.



Drinks, biscuits and barbecued food were available throughout the



Silloth Lifeboat Kept Busy

Stricken rib near Powfoot

Silloth lifeboat was called out at 16:25 on Saturday 3 August, to assist with the recovery of a rib with one person on board, whose engine had failed near Powfoot, Scotland. The tide was ebbing very quickly and there was little time for the lifeboat to get up to the Scottish coast whilst there was still enough water for the lifeboat to reach the stricken vessel and tow her safely back to Annan.

The lifeboat made good time up to the vicinity of the rib but the water was receding so quickly, they were not able to go directly to the boat but had to try to weave their way in-between the sandbanks, trying to find channels deep enough to take even the shallow depth of hull of the Atlantic 85 lifeboat. The lifeboat had to negotiate the shallowest of waters, the lowest Spring tides, the constantly shifting landscape of sandbanks in the Solway Firth, in their search to find a way through. They had to travel miles out of their way just to find enough water to reach the casualty. In some places the sandbanks are so high, that although the lifeboat was very close to the rib, they could not see it, nor could the lifeboat's radar pick up the exact position of the

The casualty vessel was asked



to let off a hand held flare in order that the crew could pinpoint the boat, which it did, but due to the weather conditions that were so benign at the time, the smoke from the flares instead of going up into the air, just hung over the sea and was horizontal rather than vertical. With the height of the sandbanks, this meant that the smoke was not visible to the lifeboat crew.

The vessel was in contact with the lifeboat, the Coastguard and the boathouse at all times. It had dropped anchor but was not being held sufficiently to stop it drifting. The skipper is an experienced sailor and at no time was he in danger. Several more flares were deployed, one of which was seen by the lifeboat but by this time they were unable to reach the rib.

By 23:45 the lifeboat was able to make their way again, they hastened towards the stricken vessel but although there was more water this time, it was pitch black. The sandbanks still caused a huge problem as there were several hours to go before high tide and the lifeboat had to wend its way backwards and

forwards towards the casualty. Radio contact was resumed and eventually each boat could see each others lights. The lifeboat reached the rib at 00:43 (Sunday 4 August) when they were able to ascertain that the casualty was safe and well. A tow rope was made fast to the rib and the lifeboat began to tow it back to Annan. Finding a safe route through the mouth of the river, with no landmarks or pointers to guide or help them in any way, was very tricky in the darkness, Silloth lifeboat however successfully navigated the river and the rib was tied up to the quayside at Annan.

The lifeboat was then able to proceed back to the boathouse at Silloth and then was made ready for further service by 02:50 am.

Swimmers at West Beach, Silloth

On a hot Bank Holiday Sunday 25th August, Silloth RNLI lifeboat was called out to three people seemingly in distress in the sea at West Beach, Silloth, near Tommy Legs.

The boat launched within five minutes after being alerted to the suspected casualties.

The RNLI lifeboat had been informed about the swimmers, by a member of the public, who witnessed their seeming difficulties and had phoned the lifeboat station.

The lifeboat was quickly on the scene, as well as two members of the Shore crew who drove round to the West Beach to see if they could assist. Two lifeboat crew swam to the shore from the boat, after ascertaining that the three people thought to be in distress had made it safely back to the beach.

The lifeboat was stood down twenty five minutes after being launched and returned to the boathouse, all suspected casualties being safe and well.

Should you see anything that may concern you regarding any suspected casualties or incidents at sea, it is always better to dial 999 and ask for the Coastguard.

Jet Ski in Difficulty

On Sunday 25th August Silloth RNLI lifeboat was called out to attend a jet skier who had fallen off his craft and was having difficulty in climbing back on.

The casualty was only a few hundred yards from the lifeboat station, where the jet ski had launched from, so within a few minutes the lifeboat was in attendance.

All safe and well.

Stricken Jet Ski at West Beach

On Sunday 8th September at 12:10, Silloth RNLI lifeboat was called out to a broken down jet ski, just South of Silloth pier by the West Beach. The lifeboat had just returned to the boathouse after the usual Sunday morning exercise, when the call came in to help the

stricken vessel. The lifeboat was returned to the water and made its way quickly to the casualty, who was unable to re start the jet ski.

It was a calm day with an ebbing tide. Maryport Coastguard was also involved in the incident.

Silloth RNLI lifeboat was able to secure the jet ski to the side of the boat and took the casualty and the jet ski back to the slipway by the boathouse, where it was successfully recovered from the



Summer afternoons can bring an unexpected sight for new visitors to West Beach. The appearance of a cargo vessel sailing close by in front of them can cause sun worshippers to sit up and take notice. Heads turn as they watch the ship come to a halt off the port and perform a pirouette in preparation to enter the dock at high water. Armed with their mobiles, some gather for a closer look and film the ship as it makes the tricky manoeuvre towards the calmer waters of the

A recent example was SEA HUNTER which arrived on a glorious afternoon from La Pallice, a port on the French Atlantic coast. The ship, fully laden with wheat, had taken three days to reach Silloth via the English Channel and Irish Sea. Although registered in the Barbados capital of Bridgetown, the ship is British owned and operates in European waters. SEA HUNTER attracted attention with onlookers enquiring about where the ship

had come from and its cargo. Such close access to a passing ship must be an unexpected bonus for new visitors to the town and provide a notable memory for landlubbers. Perhaps when they look back through their holiday snaps a new interest in shipping may be sparked.

The ship was soon manoeuvring alongside her berth in readiness to begin unloading. Twenty four hours later she was ready to depart for Teesport, which is an unusual destination

SILLOTH

for ships leaving Silloth as it involves the long sailing around the north of Scotland with no payload. Passers-by may have been lucky enough to catch the ship's departure, however observers get very little notice of a ship's

movement before it is speeding through the dock entrance and away into the Solway. The next port of call would be Workington anchorage to allow the pilot to disembark before setting off in a northerly direction.

Another good month for the port of Silloth.

The ever present Zapadnyy was back early in August, followed closely by Sea Hunter with Wheat for the Mill, Ayress brought us more logs too, all in the first week of August!

Sea Lady, one of Tommy Nicholson's Trawlers has been in port having a refit, new brake linings on all their winches and some engine overhauls as well.

Three more cargoes of Fertiliser and a German Wheat all pushed our monthly total cargo to over 16,000 tonnes, which is very good for us.

The Bardera Segundo arrived to carry out some ploughing in the dock to try to reduce the overall level in the dock, this was not successful, although they have cut a slot through the middle of the dock which allows the vessels to at least get inside.

Unfortunately on Friday the 30th around 22:30 the tide was pretty rough and has dislodged our north dock gate and the hinge pin has dropped into the dock, behind the gate. We are arranging cranes and engineers to recover the hinge pin after lifting the gate clear, we hope to be able to recover the pin from the sluice pits, repair/upgrade it and then put it back in place.

All being well, this could be completed within the month of September.

It looks like September is beginning well too with one ship already having been in port and three more currently scheduled.
