## Causewayhead W.I.

On a stormy night, 16 members met in Carlisle to visit the Magistrates Courts.

We were met by Doug Graham and instructed to turn off our mobiles, not to smoke, and not to get left behind on the tour. Everyone passed through the security scanner at the top of the stairs in case any of us were carrying weapons.

Doug is the leader of the seven teams of magistrates, 25 in all, who sit on the bench in Carlisle. Each bench consists of three persons. Carlisle is the busiest court in the county, and most cases pass through it, only piracy and treason go directly to the Crown Court.

We sat in the waiting room, no frills here, metal furniture fastened to the floor. Sharp edges are avoided as there have been fights. Drug dealing can also take place. We visited two courts, court three and the Security Court. Court Three is a non custodial court and deals with fines and probation orders. The Security Court is one in which the prisoners are brought in handcuffs and sit in a reinforced glass box. There are two television screens for a video link.

We sat in this court and our president looked quite at home sitting in the chief magistrates chair. Jean Graham was put in the prisoner's glass box for having the temerity to yawn while Doug was talking to us.

Throughout Doug answered our questions with great patience. We were dismayed to hear of the increase in domestic violence, in drug dealing and in internet pornography.

Would any of us apply to be a magistrate?

The age limit is 62, and one needs to be a good listener, a good communicator, and most of all, have a sense of humour.
