2005 started with severe gales and floods, the HOO FALCON with fertilizer from Holland being delayed on passage, further delayed in port and then unable to sail due to the ferocity of the storms.

The next vessel was the Russian ship KONSTANTIN PAVSTOYSKIY with fertilizer from Mwga in Lithuania and the KORALLE with wood pulp from Antwerp.

The SANDAL then brought a cargo of wheat from Volgast in Germany and the ARKLOW SURF a cargo of fertilizer from Ijmuiden in Holland.

The tanker ANETTE THERESA arrived with a cargo of molasses from Bremen and the BEN MAYE brought a cargo of wheat from Liverpool.

Finally, the WAHLSTEDT brought fertilizer from Ternuezen making a total of eight ships for the month.

February was a quiet month with only five ships visiting the port.

The first ship was the HAV ANDROMEDA with wheat followed by the ANETTE THERESA with molasses and the MONA with fertilizer, all from Holland.

The ATLANTIC HAV brought a cargo of wheat from Bonnières in France and the NORDSTRAND a cargo of fertilizer from Ijmuiden.
