

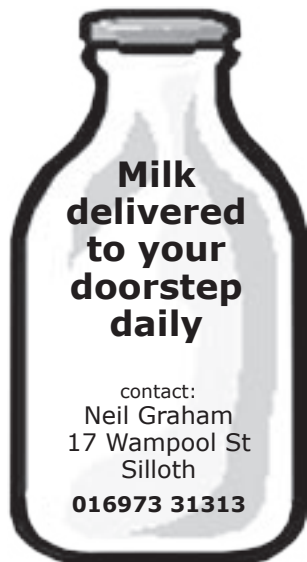

Banty Trot



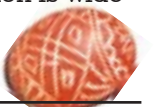
Banty Trot new leader David (Brightly Lighty) Lightfoot

Championship we will be hosting three other major events: the Stock Hatch National Championships 2005, the stock hatch class was introduced to allow a cheap entry into Autograss racing, where all the cars use standard parts off the shelf.

Round 2 of the F600 Stock Specials Championship. The F600 is another budget class that was introduced by Leewood Autograss Club to get racers into the "specials class" without spending too much money.

Round 3 of the newly reinstated Sportway Northern Challenge will see a lot of new drivers

at Silloth from clubs like Yorkshire Dales, York, Whiterose and Scarborough.

The biggest event in 2005 for Solway Autograss Club is the Men's National Championship. We are in a league with Yorkshire Dales Autograss Club and for the third time in five years the Dales league are hosting The Men's National Autograss Championship at Thornborough, North Yorkshire.

400 cars get ready to race on the Saturday morning, 40 in each of the 10 technical classes. There are twelve trophies to race

for, one for each class plus the Champion of Champions (a handicap race between the ten class winners) and the League Shield.
