


## A Drawing for our Little Buzzers to Join-Up and a Quiz



This time we have a rather difficult drawing for you to do, but it will be well worth the effort if you take care. We suggest you use a colour pen and follow these instructions carefully.


Starting with number 1 draw a line to each numbered dot as follows:

National Year of the Volunteer: An Opportunity for businesses to put something back into their local communities

Cumbria ProHelp recruits professional volunteers from all areas of business, who offer their skills and experience to small voluntary and community groups across Cumbria. Matches are made between groups and volunteers by Cumbria ProHelp Coordinators, who recruit and support volunteers and consider all requests for assistance from groups.

The current Directory of Volunteers includes architects and accountants, solicitors and trainers, IT and HR Consultants, plus many more. They provide assistance with business planning, marketing and publicity, health and safety issues and a host of other projects.

Already this year, many new matches have been made, including one between Debbie Davidson of HR-X Consultancy and the Northern Fells Group. Debbie will be working closely with the coordinator of the Northern Fells Group, which provides a wide range of support services to the rural communities of the northern fells,

assisting with the development of various policies and procedures to enable the group to provide a professional service to both it's staff and volunteers, and the users of the service.

Cumbria ProHelp is also pleased to welcome new members Host & Build, who, in association with Cumbria Credits, are offering a range of FREE activities and courses throughout the county to community groups and individuals, which will take place in their network of Community Development Centres. They are offering FREE professional advice and support to local voluntary and community organisations who would like to improve their basic skills and understanding of ICT and computers.

These activities are supported through the New Opportunities Fund (NOF).

Cumbria ProHelp is part of a national scheme and is supported by the Community Fund, Northern Rock Foundation and Rural Regeneration Cumbria.
