• An existing Development & Training Centre in Wigton – The Family Centre

This funding forms part of the overall £1 million that NWRDA earmarked to each of the Market Towns Initiatives. A preliminary expenditure grant of just under £70,000 was approved in the summer of 2004 to allow for two pieces of feasibility work and a master planning exercise to commence. These included:

- Solway Tourism Partnership Branding Study
- The Gathering Place Feasibility Study, and
- Wigton Townscape Regeneration Masterplan

NWRDA has also invested over £100,000 to support the costs of a dedicated Project Manager and Project Administrator, and funding to purchase a building to secure the future of one of the key projects.

Gerald Sewell, Chairman of the NAP said, 'This is very satisfying outcome to all our negotiations with NWRDA over the past year or so. It sends out a clear message and

gives the green light to everyone involved in the various initiatives across North Allerdale. Their projects can now go ahead. One has to remember, of course, that this overall approval is only the first step in a long process that will involve a lot of hard work. Each project and scheme, whether in Aspatria, Wigton, Silloth, or hinterland, will need to submit further bids and performance plans for approval, in order to draw down the cash for each phase of development.

Along with many people I am delighted at this result. This outcome has been the result of co-operation and hard work on the part of many people from the three towns and surrounding area in North Allerdale - their effort has now borne fruit. NWRDA has helped us considerably in formulating this bid and throughout the process we have been helped and supported by Allerdale Council's Regeneration

The scheme of projects submitted will focus on addressing

economic, employment and training needs of Aspatria, Silloth and Wigton and their surrounding parishes and for members of the Partnership, this latest funding success has been the result of a considerable amount of effort and time invested by the people involved.

Victoria Nixon, the NAP Project Manager said, 'NWRDA's commitment to the area through the Partnership acknowledges the economic needs of this community and will allow the Partnership to continue its work to attract funding for further projects. This is a very positive reflection of all the efforts put in by the many volunteers'.

Fraudster Caught

Allerdale Borough Council has successfully prosecuted a man for falsely claiming housing and council tax benefits.

Stephen Campbell, 33, formerly of Welton, Carlisle, was fined £125 and £75 costs by Carlisle Magistrates after he failed to notify Allerdale Borough Council of a change in circumstances in relation to a benefits claim.

His application was granted in May 2004 and the benefits continued to be paid until the Council received notification on 3 September 2004 from the Department for Work and Pensions that Mr Campbell had commenced paid employment on 21 June 2004.

Mr Campbell received overpayment of benefits of £479.79.

A payment agreement to recover the money has been made between Mr Campbell and Allerdale Borough Council.
