#### IMPORTANT NOTICE REGARDING **FLU VACCINATIONS**

We strongly recommend that all of our patients who are over the age of 65 or suffer from chronic respiratory disease including asthma, chronic heart disease or diabetes to contact the surgery to make arrangements to have a flu vaccination as soon as possible. If you are unable to visit the surgery and feel that a home visit is appropriate please let us know so that we can arrange this for you. Also if you are a carer and require a flu vaccination this offer is also open to you.

If you are not in the above category but would like to have a flu vaccination this may be possible when all of our patients who fit the above criteria have been offered a flu vaccination. Please contact the surgery towards the end of November to check if we have sufficient stock left.

### PATIENT EXPERIENCE SURVEY

A new national survey is to be introduced later this year. This survey will over time help the Government understand, from the patient's perspective, how well action to deliver national priorities is being implemented. The Department of Health are to randomly select patients from our patient list who have had an "access" experience between 16th July and 15th October 2006. These patients will then be sent the patient survey questionnaire to complete in early January 2007. Patient data to be extracted will include: Patients NHS Number, name, address, date of birth and gender.
