
The Winner - Mr & Mrs Frank Scott of Blitterlees

Wigton Choral Society's Christmas concert on December 13th marked the end of a successful first year in charge for musical director Ian Wright, who took over the baton when Ian Hare stepped down after 17 years.

The concert, at St Mary's Church in Wigton, saw a collaboration with a local children's choir for the highlight of the evening, a performance of And Peace on Earth by Bob Chilcott, which sets traditional Christmas poems to new groovy styles. Ian Wright said: "This will be my first Christmas concert with Wigton Choral Society, and I hope to build on the success of our summer concert with an enjoyable programme full of variety. From the popular Gaudete to the rich unaccompanied

harmonies of Morton Lauridsen's O Magnum Mysterium, there will be something for everyone. We are particularly looking forward to Bob Chilcott's Christmas cantata And Peace on Earth which sets traditional Christmas poems to new styles, including jazz and gospel. Bob Chilcott is best known as one of The King's Singers and was responsible for arranging

much of their music. His pieces combine beautiful harmonies with imaginative effects and a good dose of fun.

The concert also featured a selection of carols, old and new, including a new carol by local composer Andrew Sievewright, who was present at the concert. Accompaniment was provided by Hugh Davies on organ and Amanda Wright on piano.

New Hearing Aid Support

Bridging the Gap Drop-in Moves to the NEW one stop-shop

Locals in Wigton and the surrounding area including Silloth who are troubled by their lack of hearing can now visit our monthly drop-in at the LOCAL LINKS OFFICE.

Due to the enthusiasm of the local community, Bridging the Gap project has decided to offer the service in a more convenient location. Starting on January the 23rd and then every 4th Friday from 10am till 12noon the drop-in will offer an NHS battery exchange, a referral service to Social Services equipment loan, for loop systems etc.

Catholic Caring services, the parent Charity that run the Project, now operate a total of 18 drop-in clinics throughout the county, helping over 300 people a month.

Hugh Stirling the Project Leader says "This is a really great project to be involved with, we make such a huge difference for many people, some are very isolated and cut off by their hearing loss. Many people just need to know how to get their aid in, or how to work the buttons. The Project is also able to do a re-tubing service and clean hearing aids, we accept self referral, or from Care or Health professionals".

The project offers a home visiting service for people who are unable to come to the drop-in.

Mrs Y from Wigton said "this is a wonderful service, it is not so easy getting batteries now the postage has gone up, and with the new phone I am able to hear people much better".

Tickets for this event are only £3 and the ticket price includes a buffet provided by Philo.



Residents of Allerdale are warned that some Council services have been affected by the recent frosty weather conditions.

Due to the temperatures dropping below freezing point, several public toilets which are owned and maintained by Allerdale Borough Council have had to be closed for safety reasons.


However, the following public toilets will remain open:

The Council is liaising with Cumbria Highways and will not deploy its road sweeping vehicles if roads have been gritted, so as not to sweep up the grit needed to thaw out icy driving conditions.

SCTC Airline Day

Year 9 students at Solway Community Technology College aimed for Gold as they took part in "Airline Day". All students took part in the day's challenge to make a three course meal suitable for an airline.

This motivational day was the culmination of weeks of planning, preparation and practicing practical skills to ensure that the final products displayed were the very best that they could produce.

The design and make an Airline Meal project gave the students free rein to come up with an appropriate menu, having taken into consideration the dietary, religious and cultural requirements of a variety of passengers. Students had also to consider the corporate image of their imaginary airline and produce an accompanying tray mat and menu with their company logo displayed.

Throughout the day students developed their organisational skills, working as a team and gained the satisfaction of producing a very special finished product of which they were justifiably proud. Skills gained are very valuable in today's society – the ability to cook meals for themselves, follow basic hygiene rules, plan and organise themselves, work to set deadlines and see a project through, identifying at the end what they have done well and what they could improve.

Student achievement at the end of the day is



credited by awarding a Bronze, Silver or Gold school award against the pre-agreed criteria that reflects the constraints of time and space on an aeroplane. Three students who produced exceptional meals and demonstrated outstanding practical skills as well as providing additional evidence of independent work that reflected thought and consideration for the needs of their passengers were awarded the prestigious school "Diamond" award. This year this top award was achieved by Oliver Neilly, Louis Graham and Holly Harper who were absolutely thrilled with their work.

In addition to raising motivation and standards within the Design Technology department, this project work also provides the evidence to achieve a COPE (certificate of personal effectiveness) credit.

Purple Bag Scheme

Allerdale Borough Councils latest kerbside recycling scheme was recently delivered to Silloth and is currently being extended to areas of Aspatria. 'The Purple Bag Scheme' is for the collection of glass bottles and jars, metal food and drink cans and plastic bottles from domestic properties.

The bags are collected

fortnightly from the front of the property in one vehicle; they are sorted later using a combination of magnets and screens. The advantage of this kind of collection is that as well as being convenient for the householder; collection of the bags is extremely efficient allowing Allerdale Borough Council to currently

collect purple bags from over 20,000 properties.

So far, the purple bag scheme has diverted over 500 tonnes of recyclables from landfill.

If you have Allerdale's other kerbside recycling collections; paper/card and garden bin don't forget make use of them. As well as diverting huge volumes of recyclables from landfill, using these recycling bins will remove a large amount of waste from your rubbish bin particularly important in the run up to Christmas. Silloth Businessman Fined for Smoking

Council issues first smoke free fines in Cumbria

Allerdale Borough Council has become the first local authority in Cumbria to issue fixed penalty notices under new legislation to stub out smoking in public places.

The Council has fined two men on two separate occasions for smoking in the workplace, which risks damaging the health of other people.

In the first case, a male worker at a Workington factory was given a £50 fine after he was found having a cigarette inside the premises.

The discovery was made by one of Allerdale Borough Council's smoke free officers during a routine inspection of businesses last month.

The officer noticed there were "no smoking" signs displayed but found three members of staff stood by a worktop – one with a lit cigarette in his hand.

The man walked towards the officer but disappeared from view for a moment. When he returned the cigarette had gone from his hand.

When asked about it he admitted he had put the lit cigarette down on the worktop. The man went with the officer to his employer's office where he was cautioned for the offence.

A £50 fixed penalty notice was issued to the employee by post. The fine was reduced to £30 as the man paid within 15 days.

In the second case, the owner of a Silloth business was found smoking inside the premises – which are visited by members of the public.

An Allerdale Borough Council smoke free officer noted that "no smoking" signs were not displayed and there were used cigarette ends inside the property.

The man admitted he knew he should not have been smoking inside the building and he was issued with a £50 fixed penalty notice on site. This was reduced to £30 for prompt payment.

The man was reminded of the smoke free legislation and given an information leaflet.


Councillor Sam Standage, Allerdale Borough Council Executive member with responsibility for Environmental Health, said: "It is important that people realise the implications of ignoring the law on smoking in public places.

"Not only do they face having to pay a fine,

they are also putting the health of their colleagues and customers at risk from second-hand smoke inhalation, as well as making it harder for those smokers who are trying to kick the habit.

"This legislation supports one of Allerdale Borough Council's top priorities in its Corporate Improvement Plan 2008 to 2011, which is to improve the health, wellbeing and safety of all our citizens."



Over the last two years we have been trying to make Silloth Christmas lights a success. This year we have started to achieve what we want our town to look like. Over the next few years we are aiming to make Silloth one of the best lit-up towns in Cumbria. This can only be achieved by all the residence of Silloth, many of whom who have already kindly donated and helped to make this event possible.

As you can see, this year we have only got two streets lit-up, Eden Street and Station Road. To enable us to cross over the streets we needed permission from Highways and Byways, also the owners of properties which have fixing brackets attached. The committee would like to thank these individuals for being so supportive. Even before we purchased any new lights, the fixing brackets, cables, etc, cost £2,500 and all fixings had to be tested by Lloyds Standards up to 400kg per bracket.

This year we have chosen L.E.D. bulbs which should last hopefully around ten years before they need replacing. In the past we have just had normal 40w coloured bulbs costing £700 per year but are so easily broken most need replaced every year, so costing wise L.E.D. bulbs are the best option. These bulbs alone cost £2,702 for 1,000. All electrical work was carried out by Sean Bell and his men, we would like to thank you for your time and effort, and you're big bill, cheers.

The Santa dash and blind auction were another success, this year raising over £2,500. Over 150 Santa's paraded our streets then down to the Rugby Club for the blind auction and raffle. Give yourselves a pat on the back if that's possible, if you did attend and supported this fantastic day.

Many local businesses donated to this auction,

and you will see in the thank-you list how many generous people we have in this small community.

We aim to do this every year, so if you want to be a part of this next year just get into a Santa suit and join the fun, the more the Merrier Christmas. We have listed the names of people we wish to give special thanks to. We are sorry if you have been part of this and have not got a mention, but Johnstone used the list to start his bonfire. But we would like to take this opportunity once more and thank everyone involved.

Despite torrential rain and gale force winds many hardy regulars turned out for the monthly coffee morning held on October 4th.




