

Mr & Mrs Dennis **Darling of Skinburness** celebrated their 60th Wedding Anniversary on 7th May.


Both Dennis and Jean were very pleased to receive congratulations and a signed photograph



## Causewayhead WI

On Wednesday 8th April Causewayhead WI were fortunate to have Clive Firth of the Solway Wood Carvers Group give a talk and demonstration on wood carving. He was introduced by President Pat Bell.

Clive started by giving a short history of carving and explained the difference between the traditional style and the art style. The traditional style was used on cathedrals and public buildings and wood can also be added to this particular style. He also explained the difference between different types of clamps and their uses. He went on to explain that in lettering a fish tail chisel is used. To illustrate some of the types of carving that can be achieved he handed round work that he had carved, e.g. a Viking, clown, umbrella and slave. Clive also brought along photographs of other pieces that he had carved, particularly a coffee table, which was obviously too large to bring on the evening. Some of the work was extremely intricate and others quite simple in design. In his early days of carving he used to make wooden toys. When new members join the group they are asked to carve a leaf on a block of

wood – an example was shown to everyone in various stages of carving. Lime is a popular wood to use for carving and lime trees were introduced and planted in England by Charles II. Clive also stated that anyone can learn to carve and that in the group were two young boys one being only 9 years old. Later in the evening this boy came and showed us the lettering he was carving.

The whole evening proved to be a fascinating insight into this wonderful and rewarding craft. A vote of thanks was given by Olga Hetherington who stated that this area was renowned for its Arts and Crafts.

The darts (A team) were congratulated on their efforts and thanks also went to those who had gone along to support

C.A.L.C. requested nominations to the Standards Committee of Allerdale Borough Council, no nomination forthcoming.

Planning applications approved by both the Town Council Committee and that of Allerdale Borough Council were noted.

Reports from representatives and outside bodies included, Joint Advisory Committee whereby notice has been given by the Government Inspector to approve the construction of a wind farm at Park Head Farm. Regeneration, a written update of the position regarding the Heritage Lottery Fund

bid was circulated, which included notes on a preliminary board meeting held with all stakeholders. Many more meetings are to be held with a view to the submission of the stage 2 bid in December, approval should be known by the end of March 2010. 



## May Day Warning

Avoid a 'May Day' this bank holiday. Water users are being encouraged by the **Royal National Lifeboat** Institution (RNLI) to put safety first over the May Day bank holiday. Whether planning a day at the beach or taking to the seas, the lifesaving charity is asking people to consider important safety measures to help ensure they enjoy the water.

On the May Day bank holiday weekend last year, RNLI volunteer lifeboat crews launched 167 times to help those in danger at sea, rescuing 204 people. Over the same weekend, the charity's lifeguards responded to 86 incidents and helped 119 people in trouble on the beach.

The RNLI provides a 24-hour maritime search and rescue service, with over 230 lifeboat stations



around the coast of the UK and Ireland. The charity also has more than 140 lifeguard units on beaches around the UK – 30 of which will be operational (in Cornwall, Devon, Dorset and Wales) from Friday 1 May 2009.

To help the beachgoing and sea-faring public stay safe and enjoy their bank holiday, the RNLI is offering these essential safety tips:

Beach Safety top tips:

1. Always swim at a

lifeguarded beach, between the red and yellow flags.

2. Never use inflatables in strong winds or rough seas.

3. Check times of high and low tide before you go – to avoid getting stranded.
4. If you get into trouble, stick your hand in the air and shout for help.
5. If you see someone else

5. If you see someone else in trouble, tell a lifeguard. If you can't see a lifeguard, call 999 or 112 and ask for the Coastguard.

## Hellrigg Wind Farm Inquiry

Allerdale Borough Council is disappointed at the outcome of the recent inquiry over plans for a wind farm at Park Head Farm, Silloth.

The Council's Development Panel voted to refuse to grant planning permission for four 396 foot high wind turbines in December 2007, following more than 1,000 local objections including residents, Silloth Town Council and Cumbria Wildlife Trust, which feared the development could damage tourism hopes for the nearby Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.

The decision was overturned this week by the Government's Planning Inspectorate following a three-day planning inquiry held in February.

Nick Fardon,
Allerdale Borough
Council's Director of
Strategic Resources,
said: "We are extremely
disappointed by the
outcome of the inquiry,
especially since we fought
so hard on behalf of our
concerned residents to
support the decision
of our democratically
elected members.

"The Council used an experienced barrister and recognised experts to present its case. Despite all efforts to minimise the costs it still cost the Council £75,000. It is a major regret that this whole process has cost the Council so much but we felt it was important we took a stand to defend the interests of our residents who made their opposition to the plans so evident. It highlights the difficult position Councils face in dealing with these applications and the costs involved which would be the same whether the Council won or lost."







## Golf Club Drive-In




The new season for Silloth on Solway Golf Club got under way with the Club Captains Drive-In on 15th March.
