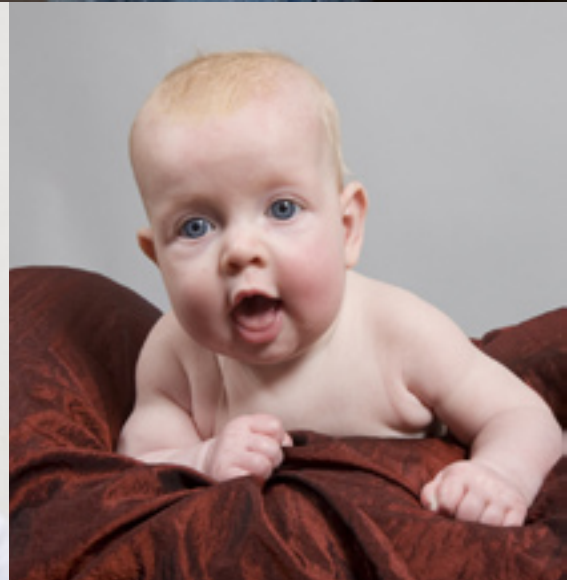

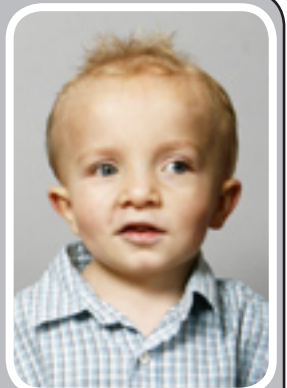

Electoral Boundary Changes

Voters in Allerdale should be aware that some wards in the borough will become part of different Parliamentary constituencies as from this year's general election, as a result of nationwide boundary changes.

- Crummock, Dalton, Derwent Valley and Keswick wards will move from the Workington electoral district to become part of the Copeland constituency.
- Warnell and Wigton wards will remain in the

Penrith and the Border constituency.

- Marsh, Wampool and Waver – which are currently part of Penrith and the Border – will revert to the Workington constituency.

- All other wards in Allerdale will remain part of the Workington constituency.

Sarah Beattie, Allerdale Borough Council's Democratic Services Manager, said: "Put simply, the boundary changes mean a difference

in who you can vote for to represent you as an MP in general elections. Residents living in these wards will still be part of the borough of Allerdale, still receive their local services from Allerdale Borough Council and still be represented by their same local councillors."

Busiest Ever Year for RNLI

RNLI crews in the north of England rescued 961 people and launched 1,282 times last year – a 24 per cent increase in launches on 2008 and a three per cent rise on the previous record year, 2003.

The busiest lifeboat station in the charity's north division was Sunderland RNLI, with 101 launches, followed by Skegness (82); Hartlepool (81); Blackpool (76) and Fleetwood (73).

During the November floods in Cumbria, the RNLI also helped more than 200 Cockermouth residents reach safety in some of the worst conditions the charity's specialist Flood Rescue Team has ever encountered.

Across the UK and

Ireland, crews also had their busiest year in the RNLI's 186-year history, launching 9,154 times and rescuing 8,186 people. The charity's lifeguards responded to 13,588

incidents and assisted 15,954 people – the highest number since the service began in 2001.

RNLI lifeguards were operating in the north of England for the first time in 2009, patrolling beaches in Tyne and Wear, North and East Yorkshire and Lincolnshire. Together, they dealt with 1,468 incidents and helped 1,508 people.

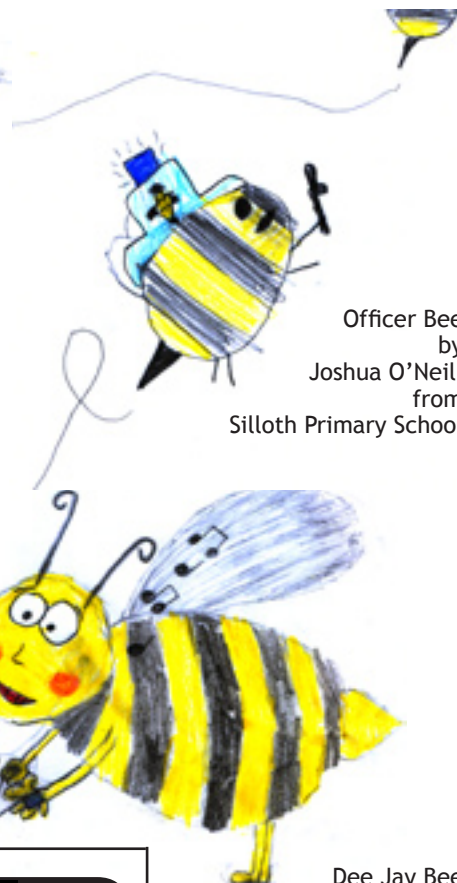
pink, great for a party, we thought she looked wicked.

Sir Richard Branson, President of Virgin Atlantic, said: 'Everyone who has seen the sheer destruction in Haiti over the last few days will have been moved to help in any way they can. We will fly in as much aid as possible so that the agencies on the ground can respond to the needs of everyone in Haiti whose lives have been devastated by this tragedy.'

I am pleased to say that last year, Silloth Rotary Club purchased two ShelterBoxes which are stored in preparation for such emergencies. This week on hearing of the earthquake in Haiti, the club agreed to finance yet another. So when you make your donations, as well as the many local charities some of which are mentioned above, people affected by disasters the world over are likely to benefit from your generosity.

They first received the award in 2000. To obtain the award, Environmental Health staff from the Council had to submit a written application and undergo an assessment visit.

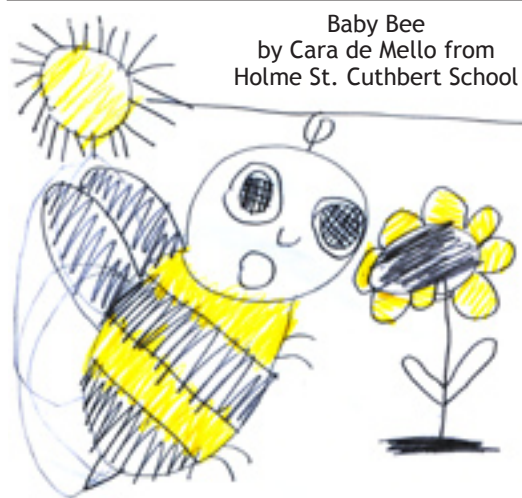
Councillor Sam Standage said: "The Council's Environmental Health Unit is the only environmental health team in the county to hold this award. To maintain the grade

Mayors Report

The Chairman has attended nine events these included the Senior School Prize Evening, the AONB AGM and three carol services.

The Police Report was given by Inspector Dennis Kelly who has recently taken over at Wigton. He gave a brief history of his 22 year service in the police force, he said the crime rate in Silloth is low with six offences in the past month, several related to anti social behaviour of some car drivers in the town. Fixed penalty notices have been issued to these drivers who still continue to block the disabled crossing points near road junctions.

Correspondence: following the Town Councils concern about the suspension of Mr Dennison at the Primary School the Education Department have stated that investigations are on hold due to the fact that one of the people involved cannot be interviewed at present on medical grounds, however the authority are keen to see the matter resolved. A letter with regard to the

flooding of the allotments, the council had the main outfall drain checked last year. We are aware of the problem but feel we have done what we can as much of the land around the area suffers the same fate at times of heavy rainfall.

Other Reports: Joint Advisory the AGM of the AONB had been well attended with good speakers and those attending felt they were being well informed of the progress within the area. STAG: The Friends of the Green Group has been set up as a requirement of The Lottery Bid. Dates have been fixed for events on the Green with several others under discussion. County Council Tony Markley gave a report into the bid to erect a temporary bridge for Workington, however permanent replacement of the existing bridges could take several years. If it was decided to re-design the structure or alter the position of a bridge then this must be funded by local authority. Tony went on to outline the counties policy on winter management, which does

not include treatment of footways. Over the past three to four weeks the authority have used a large amount of salt/grit mainly on first and second class routes. **Silloth Town Council along with Coniston have been the only two authorities in the county to undertake gritting of some streets.** After discussions it would be hoped that in the future we could do more, to this end the Town Council are looking into purchasing a small gritter to fit behind the tractor. Handyman Ken Wannop reported that over the Christmas period the works yard had suffered a break in and most of the small plant had been stolen. Ken went on to outline work in hand to date.

Requests for financial assistance were received from the following - Citizens Advice Allerdale who hold meetings in the doctors surgery, £50 was agreed. Solway School in support of an Auction of Promises to be held on 6th February in the Golf Hotel, £25 agreed. Silloth First Responders, in previous years the Town

Funding for Play Areas

The Allerdale Play Partnership is inviting applications for the second and final year of the Playbuilder grant programme to produce innovative and exciting spaces for children to play in Cumbria.

The Government initiative aims to create inspiring play spaces by changing the way they are commissioned, designed and built as part of the national Play Strategy.

It is anticipated that Allerdale will receive £100,000 to fund new and improved innovative play areas which will be opened by the end of March 2011. Peter Haley, Allerdale Borough Council's Sport and Recreation Manager,

said: "We're encouraging a wide range of people to come forward and apply for this fantastic opportunity to improve play facilities for children in their area. Applications can be made by statutory bodies such as parish, town or borough councils as well as voluntary organisations, residents associations and community groups with a suitable constitution, accounting procedures and the ability/experience of managing capital projects of a similar size and nature. Applicants may even wish to approach Allerdale Borough Council to see if it would act as a development partner. The Government's rules concerning the Playbuilder grant programme mean that schools and children's centres are not eligible to apply. Grants will be awarded based on the demonstration of social need and the suitability of schemes."

Projects must meet a number of design principles, including:

- Meet the more challenging, imaginative

and/or adventurous play needs of older children aged 8 to 13 years

- Innovatively approach natural play and/or landscaping techniques to create a stimulating environment for free play
- Provide continuous open access
- Ensure safe access for children, their families and the public

In year one of the Playbuilder grant programme - from April 2009 to March 2010 - Cumbria was allocated £533,921, of which £104,000 is being used to improve two play areas in Allerdale; Fitz Park in Keswick and Frostoms in Workington.

These projects were selected by the Allerdale Play Partnership and approved by Cumbria County Council's Children's Services team which awarded the funding for each scheme. 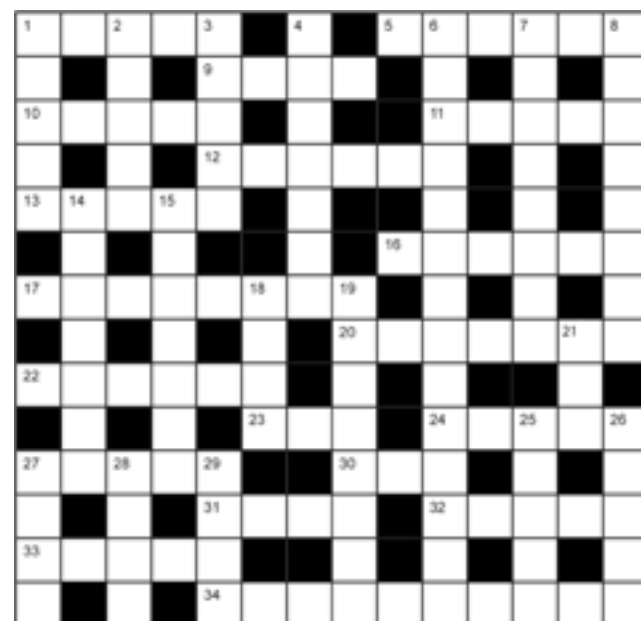
