



# The Twitterings

We're glad to be back on the pages of the Solway Buzz. Many thanks to those of you who took the time to read our first column in the January edition of this fantastic local community paper. We're looking forward to sharing more thoughts, questions and beginner's observations from the bird tables, beaches and fields around the Silloth area and also looking forward to hearing from you about your birding experiences.

This month we're writing about starling murmurations and asking you to share with us and other Solway Buzz readers your best murmuration spotting sites in and around Silloth. In preparation I thought I'd do a bit of background reading to make sure I get my facts and figures right. I typed starling murmuration into my browser hoping for a link to an informative Cumbria wildlife or RSPB website. What should pop up at the top of the list but good old Amazon offering 'low price starling murmurations!!' After having a good old laugh at the thought of a murmuration crammed in a cardboard box, we were almost tempted to order one just to see how they are packed and delivered.

A murmaration is the collective term for a gang of Starlings.
Starlings are a pretty common

bird, seen in gardens and towns all over the UK, they are brilliant mimics and often catch people out with their fantastic imitations of phones and other high pitched tech sounds, they also have amazing iridescent feathers that shine, green and blue in the right light.

From November onwards the resident UK population of starlings is bolstered by 1,000s of tourists from Scandinavia and it's at this time we start to see the amazing phenomena of swirling masses of Starlings filling our skies. The birds fly in flocks of many hundreds or thousands. They perform the most amazing aerial dance, making shapes and patterns, swooping, swirling and gathering in ever increasing numbers before settling together for the night. Scientists still don't fully understand how they synchronise their flight patterns so they don't fly into one another but they do know that the Starlings fly together like this as it confuses other larger birds of prey who hunt them if they fly and roost alone as dusk sets in.

We love following murmurations but as we both work and are either still at our desks or on our daily commute during dusk hours when the displays begin, we only get to watch them at weekends or on holidays. We often take a trip down to the



RSPB reserve at Leighton Moss in Silverdale just over the Cumbrian border. On two occasions we have been lucky enough to be in the epicentre of a murmuration. It was probably the most aweinspiring natural spectacle we have experienced; surrounded by the sound of beating wings, bombarded by 1,000s of dark

shapes at head height, with wave after wave of birds flying directly at us. Something not to be missed.

So, get out there through January and February map the Starlings as they start to gather and try to find yourself a spot to watch them as they come down to roost. Let us know your favourite spots for watching this spectacle in and

around Silloth or alternatively you can head to www.starlingsintheuk. co.uk for updates of latest sightings across the UK.

Thanks for reading, we'll be back in March. In the meantime, don't forget to watch the skies, look in hedgerows or just out of your kitchen window and see what you can see



To our helpful dishwasher who has came every year to help.


Lastly to the lovely people of Silloth who donated money that helped us to buy little extras for the

Spring is just around the corner and it won't

be long before all the bulbs we planted start popping up in the raised beds and borders.

You may have seen the Blue Hearts we have installed in the border backing onto Lawn Terrace. These indicate an area is designated for rewilding, for planting wild flowers to encourage pollinators and wild life.

Wildflowers have declined due to the loss of meadows and areas for them to produce and drop seed all leading to a decline in biodiversity. We want to encourage butterflies and insects who in turn provide food for birds and bats. Yellow Rattle will be planted, to keep the grass down allowing Cowslips, Ragged Robin and Poppies to establish. Keep a look out for them and see how many you can spot this Summer.

The log pile and bug hotel we have built provide shelter and hideaways for insects of all kinds, including Solitary Bees and Beetles. Last year a small family of frogs moved in to the compost heap attracted by the increase in earth and red worms.



Leaving a small area undisturbed in your garden or backyard will make a great hideaway for insects, birds and if you're lucky a Hedgehog. You could even create your own mini wildflower meadow by scattering a packet of mixed wildflower seeds in a large pot or container. Happy Gardening!

# Silloth Promenade Fitness Trail is Now Open, There are Two Sections of Eight Machines, Have a Go!

The new fitness trail along Silloth promenade was officially opened on Tuesday 21st January by pupils from Solway Community School with the ribbon being cut by Bridget Irwin.

It was first announced to Silloth on Solway Town Council in 2018 about getting an outdoor fitness trail along Silloth Promenade and as part of Silloth on Solway Town Plan where 658 surveys were completed, 64% said they wanted this under the Wellbeing section which is about physical, economic and social wellbeing. I also ran a poll on the Sport's Association Facebook page where 94% said they wanted this to go ahead. As part of Silloth on Solway Sport's Association I nominated our organisation to try and obtain the







It's that time of year when ship spotters struggle to photograph visiting ships. Conditions often prevent them from capturing those treasured images. It's rare for ship arrivals to coincide with daytime high tides and fine weather. A feature throughout the year has been the number of named storms which disrupted shipping heading for the port.

However, ship enthusiasts are a hardy lot and attended whenever possible to capture the action. Luckily, the sun shone on many occasions, making trips to the waterfront rewarding.

In this issue we look back to earlier in the year when the weather was more favourable and shipping plentiful. Ship movements at Silloth continued



to attract locals and visitors alike. Ships of all shapes and sizes called at the port, some making their first visit while others were regular visitors. The vessel making the most calls was EASTERN VANQUISH with cargos of wheat and fertiliser (photo in August Issue). The newest ship, FRIEDHELM, was in her first year of operation when she called

during April, while the oldest, BALTICA HAV, had completed over forty years of service.

Included here are photos not published in previous issues. The Norwegian owned BALTICA HAV is one of a fleet of fifteen vessels built to a popular design. She made her first call at Silloth in March after a ten-day sailing via the North Sea with a cargo of German wheat. There was a welcome party gathered at the dock entrance including youngsters who managed to get a response to their enthusiastic waves from the crew. In contrast, FRIEDHELM, recently built in China, had the shorter sailing from Antwerp with fertiliser. The Madeira registered ship still looked in pristine condition as it

entered the dock giving a blast on the horn to the delight of gathered youngsters.

Enthusiastic waving between crews and onlookers is a regular feature of ship arrivals at Silloth. There are two opportunities to get a response, firstly with crew stationed at the bow and secondly at the stern. These welcoming gestures are understandable given that crews will often have only had fellow crewmen for company for the last week or so. Men and women of many different nationalities are represented on these ships. Some crew will be far from home with young families, while others are old salts who take the job in their stride, on one occasion finding time to pose relaxing with a cuppa



before departure. Crewmen make great subjects to photograph and capturing these moments adds some human interest to ship photography.

# Shipping Report

Silloth had another poor month in December with only one vessel call, the Eems Sea, which has been lengthened since her last call here over three years ago. She used to be around the 88m mark and is now over 99m, a bit tight in the last turn into the port to avoid our sandbank!

Poor weather and the build up of sand in the entrance prevented a second ship arriving before the New Year hence 2025 has started quickly and we hope it will continue.

Our legal team has been

working hard on the documentation and legal terms of our Sale to FoxJackson ports and the legal agreement between ABP and FoxJackson has now been completed. This means we can now submit our details to the MMO (Marine Management Organisation) for the HRO (Harbour Revision Order) to commence, this typically takes around twelve months and can be longer, so it's back to waiting... again.
