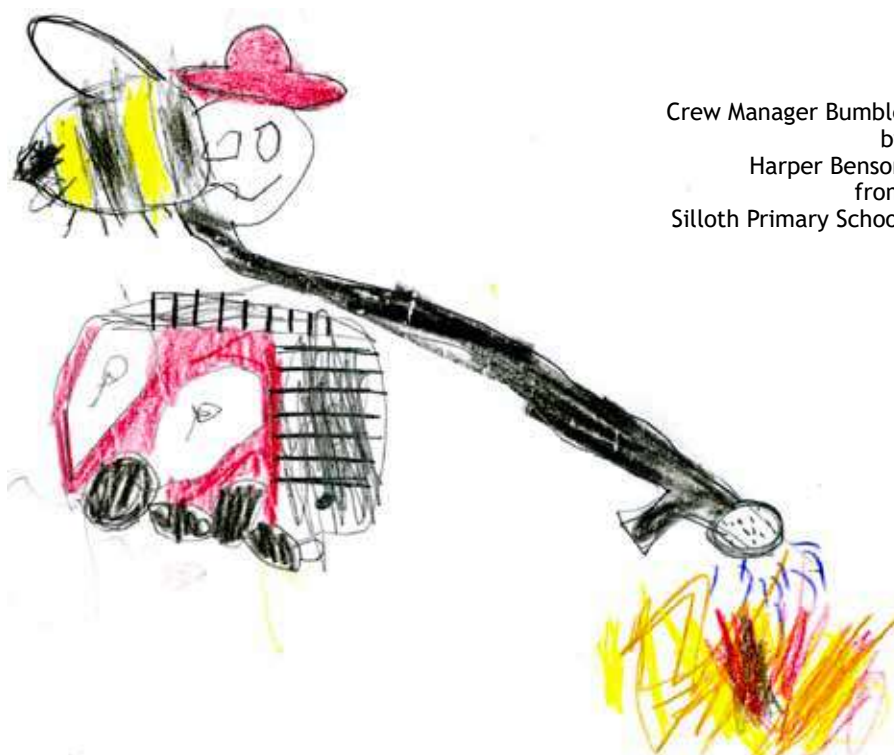
the Village Hall AND don't forget to bring your own crockery, cutlery and beverage. Of course we all look

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Christmas Fraudsters Stole £15.3M

New figures revealed victims of online shopping scams lost on average £1,000 per person during last year's festive shopping season.

The figures, which come from reports made to Action Fraud and analysed by the National Fraud Intelligence Bureau (NFIB), showed that shoppers across England, Wales and Northern Ireland were scammed out of £15.3m between November 2021 and January 2022, and that the age group most likely to fall victim was 19 to 25-year-olds.

Scams ranged from one shopper losing more than £150 trying to purchase a mobile phone on social media to another being duped out of more than £7,000 during an attempted online campervan

purchase. Meanwhile, another victim lost almost £500 when trying to buy shoes on a social media platform, and a fourth lost £145 trying to make a similar purchase.

Top tips to shop online securely this festive season: Action Fraud and the National Cyber Security Centre (NCSC) are urging online shoppers to protect their accounts, check before they buy, and use secure payment methods in order to stay ahead of the threat from criminals this shopping season:

Protect your accounts: set up 2-step verification and use three random words passwords to prevent cyber criminals from gaining access to your shopping, bank or email accounts. Choose carefully where you shop: Research online retailers,

particularly if you haven't bought from them before, to check they're legitimate. Read feedback from people or organisations that you trust, such as consumer websites. Pay securely: Use a credit card when shopping online, if you have one. Most major credit card providers protect online purchases and are obliged to refund you in certain circumstances. Using a credit card (rather than a debit card) also means that if your payment details are stolen, your main bank account won't be directly affected. Also consider using a payment platform, such as PayPal, Google or Apple Pay. And whenever you pay, look for the closed padlock in the web address bar – it means your connection is secure.

Wishing Well Theft



It is with sadness that the Members of Silloth 41 Club make this report.

Around eighty years ago Silloth Round Table built a wishing well on Silloth Green for the benefit of the youth organisations around Silloth and district. Ever since then all the money that was put into the well by children and adults has been distributed by Round Tablers, and now that the local Round Table has closed, by the ex Tablers, known as 41 club. The 41 Club members have continued to distribute the money from the wishing well in the same way, resulting in many youth organisations being supported.

Over all these years very little

damage has been done to the well, but recently a very dishonest person decided to steal the money and has caused over £100 worth of damage as well as taken any money that was in the well.

We left it unrepaired for a month and had a person watch over it, in the hope that the person responsible would be found.

So, if the dishonest person would prefer their identity to be cleared, maybe they would like to return the money they took so that we would be able to support another youth organisation in the Silloth and District area.

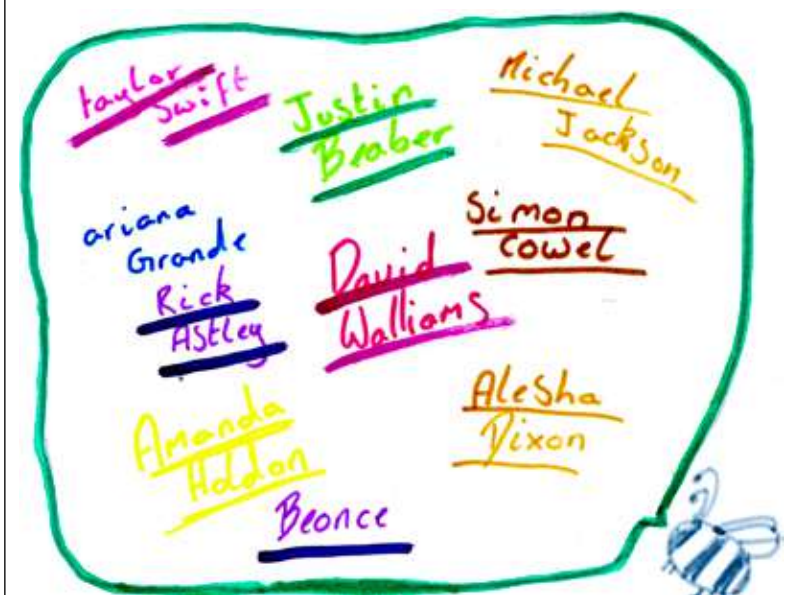

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NEW COURSES COMING TO SILLOTH COMMUNITY HALL IN JANUARY 2023



8-week Beginners Gardening course, starting on Tuesday 10 January 2023, 10.00am to 12.30pm.

The course will cover preparing the ground by planning what to grow, when to grow and how to grow to gain the maximum output (crops). How to protect crops in the open, making your own compost and fertilizer, identify aspects that could go wrong and how to remedy.



8-week Beginners Computer Skills course, starting on Tuesday 10 January 2023, 1.30pm to 4.00pm.

The course will give the student the basic aspects of computing, which will build up their confidence such as producing a letter, searching the World Wide Web (WWW), sending an 'e' Mail. The course is for the older person who has no knowledge of using a computer. The course will give the basics of using a computer such as logging on, closing down, using the keyboard, opening a programme, and other aspects will give the student confidence in using a computer.



8-week Family History course, starting on Tuesday 10 January 2023, 6.00pm to 8.00pm.

The course is about researching your family history and what it involves. This research will involve communicating with your family, looking at old photographs, letters, family Bible if you still have one, looking at Censuses, Births, Deaths and Marriages and visiting places associated with your family. Using the computer for information, visiting the library to look at old newspapers.

Saturnalia in Silloth @ Hadrian's Wall 1900



The Saturnalia Tour is being delivered to bring to a close the Hadrian's Wall 1900 Festival which began in January 2022 to celebrate the 1,900th anniversary of the

beginning of the construction of Hadrian's Wall.

Saturnalia was possibly the most popular Roman festival and is most closely associated with Christmas and merrymaking. The word 'Saturnalia' meanings 'an occasion of wild revelry or indulgence'.

Silloth Youth Club recently spent an evening creating clay images of creatures the same way that the Romans used to.

These will be fired for them.

This was just one of a series of activities in communities all the way from South Shields to Maryport.

The second last Saturnalia event is on Silloth Green from 4:30pm to 7pm on the 19th December. Entry is free and everyone is invited. The event is unlikely to be cancelled, whatever the weather, so wrap up well.

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Review of the Summer of 2022 at Silloth Dock

During a quiet autumn period at the port, an opportunity to look back at those long summer days and feature shipping not covered in previous issues. There are few better sights for ship enthusiasts than a ship approaching the port with the Scottish hills as a backdrop. An added bonus is when the scene is lit by bright sunshine. On days like those photographers go home well-pleased.

On one such day the general cargo vessel MITTELPLATE arrived with wheat from the port of Rouen. The French

port on the River Seine is a leading Western European cereal exporter. Sailing from the inland port involved an initial 75 miles along the twisting River Seine before heading west along the Channel to the Irish Sea. The Gibraltar registered ship, a new visitor to Silloth, looked in fine condition as she made her approach. The ship is operated by the German company 'Briese Shipping'. At 3,000 ton she is one of their smaller ships. The company operates a large fleet with vessels up to 60,000 tons. On the fine August afternoon

a crowd had gathered to watch the ship pass through the narrow dock entrance. It was a well controlled manoeuvre with the ship gracefully entering the outer dock.

In contrast, PAULA C arrived on a blustery July day illustrating the variability of our summer weather. As the ship approached the port interesting action photos were obtained. However, from her appearance the ship was showing signs of the rigours of life at sea and in need of a lick of paint. Nevertheless, the ship was guided smoothly into the dock loaded with a cargo of fertiliser from Belgium. The funnel logo was of the British company 'Carisbrooke Shipping' based on the Isle of Wight, and the port of registry Cowes, also on the island. The ship was another new visitor to Silloth. Let's hope she spends some time in dry dock for that lick of paint before her next visit; only the smartest ships will do for Silloth ship spotters!

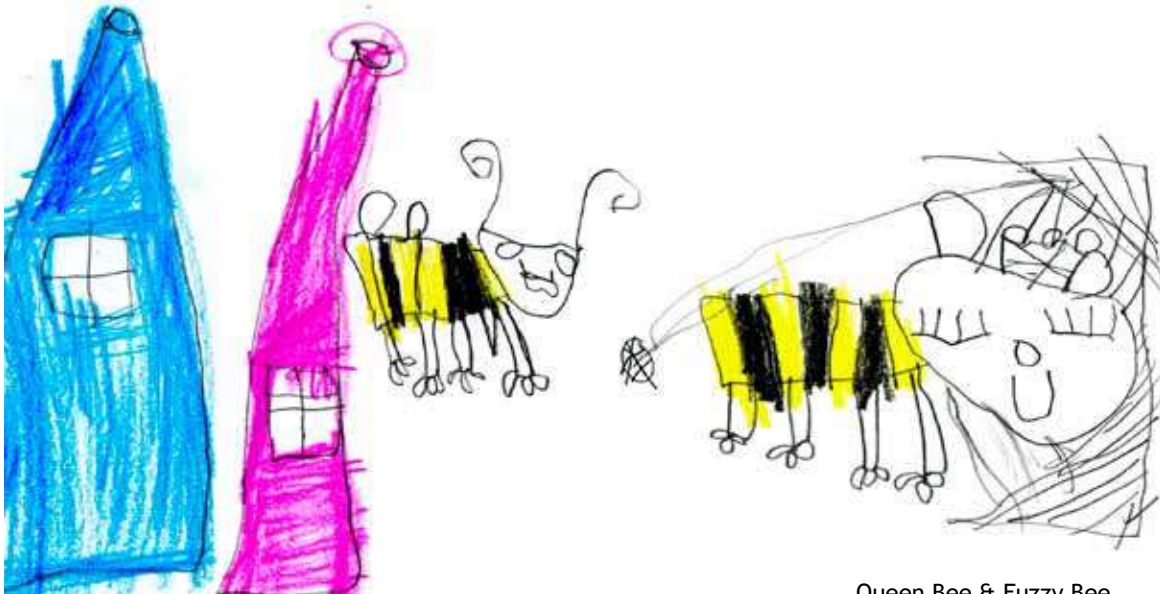

review all entries and winners will be announced at the end of January.

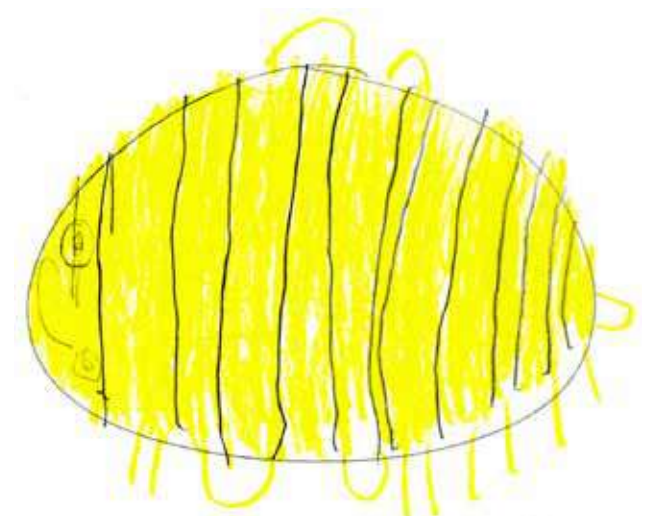

This young sportsperson was the first ever female junior national champion in Cumbria in her chosen sport of boxing. She represented England in the three nations championships taking gold in her weight class and was subsequently crowned champion of Great Britain.

Her dedication to training and ability to engage with and inspire other young people in her club in Wigton make her a fantastic role model for women in sport.



Undeclared in all of her seven contests and described as a 'force to be reckoned with' - she is a very worthy winner.

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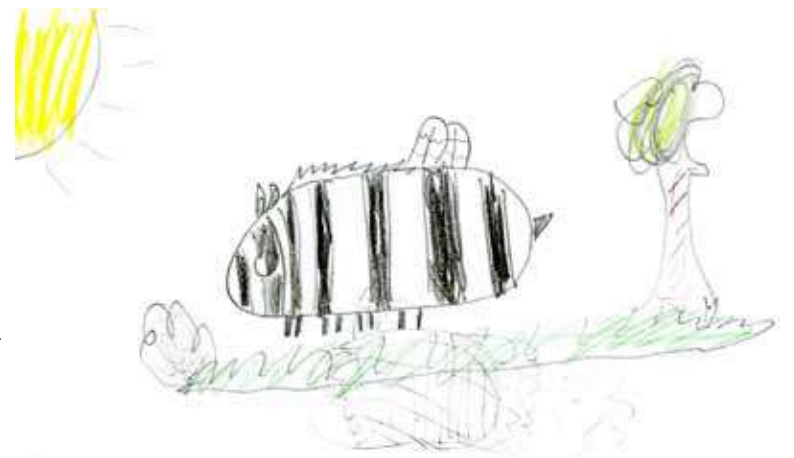

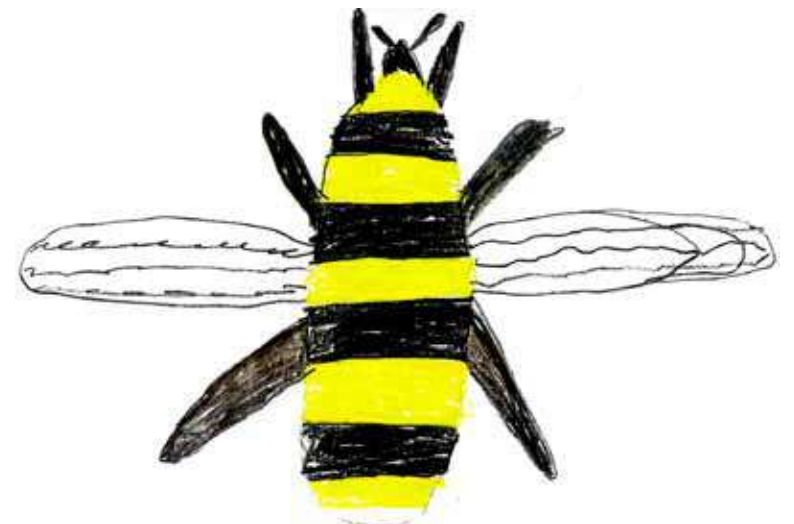

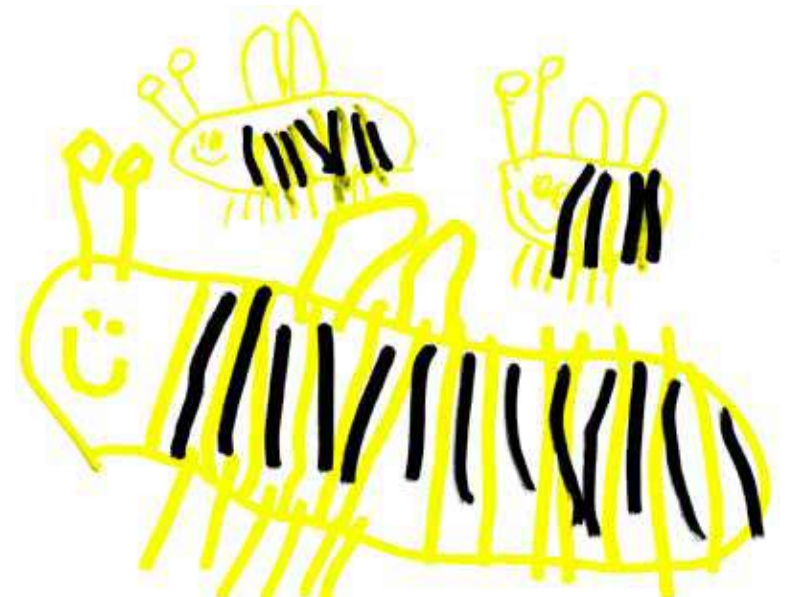
