WWII Pickett Hamilton Fort on Silloth Green

On Saturday 14th February in glorious sunny weather the brilliant Ian Ward Plant Hire and Lawson's Plant Hire did an incredible job of digging a hole, transporting a 14 tonne Pickett Hamilton Fort from Silloth Airfield and placing it in the hole on Silloth Green.

This is one of three underground Forts that were at Silloth Airfield which were used for protection against a Parachute led invasion from the German Luftwaffe in World War Two. There were around 330 put in place in Great Britain during the Second World War and only 48 now exist - one on Silloth Airfield, one on Solway Holiday Village and now one on Silloth Green

These Forts were hydraulically operated and Silloth Airfield Project have restored one of these Forts (big help from Tom, Gavin and Tarn Rumney with the pumping mechanism) so that it's original workings are back in operation and we can now pump the Turret up. We will publicise when we will carry this out on specific days.

The Fort is part of a five location Silloth Military Trail with information boards - the other locations being: Mawbray Banks, Silloth Golf Club, Causewayhead Cemetery and Grune Point this one is positioned next to the Hudson Bomber on the edge of the Silloth Green.

There are Silloth Military Trail leaflets all around Shops in Silloth as well as Abbeytown, Wigton, Carlisle, Mawbray, Allonby and Maryport.

This Summer the planting scheme will be a colourful mix of annuals and the volunteers are busy sowing, growing and bringing on the plants.

Hopefully, by the time you read this the daffodils, hyacinths and tulips in the Community Garden will be in full bloom.



We have placed the order for the replacement posts to go around the raised beds and we hope to get them installed this Spring before we have to replant the beds for Summer. We have chosen to replace the wooden posts which are rotting, despite being treated with wood preservative each year, with recycled waste plastic posts in black. They are 100% weather resistant, maintenance free and have a life expectancy of 120 years! So will see us out! We selected black to match the existing street furniture and to set off our colourful seasonal planting schemes.

We'd like to thank the Fells & Solway Community Panel, the Co-op, the Town Council, Silloth-on-Solway Community Shop, Good Causes Charity Shop, The Cumberland Building Society and all those who bought plants from our stalls. All together they've helped us raise the nearly £10,000 needed to replace the posts.



Our Annual General Meeting (AGM) is on Wednesday 15th April at 10 o'clock in the Potting Shed on the Green. All are welcome! If you are interested in joining us please do come along we are a friendly, sociable bunch. No gardening experience is needed, all tools are supplied and we always enjoy a cuppa and a craic afterwards.

After Winter, there is always Spring.

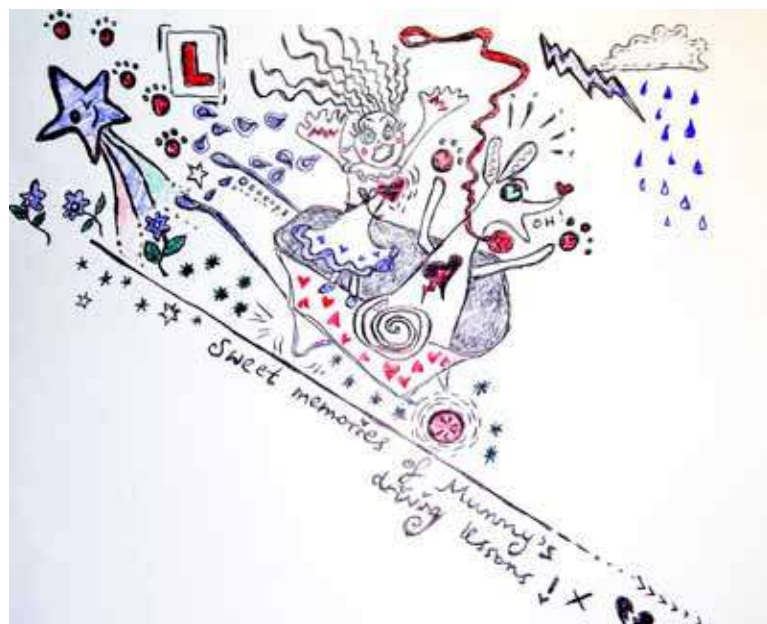
The Turning Of The Year

Thank you to everyone who has been there, showing their support during this very difficult time for my family. We received hundreds of cards and flowers, not including Facebook messages and text messages.

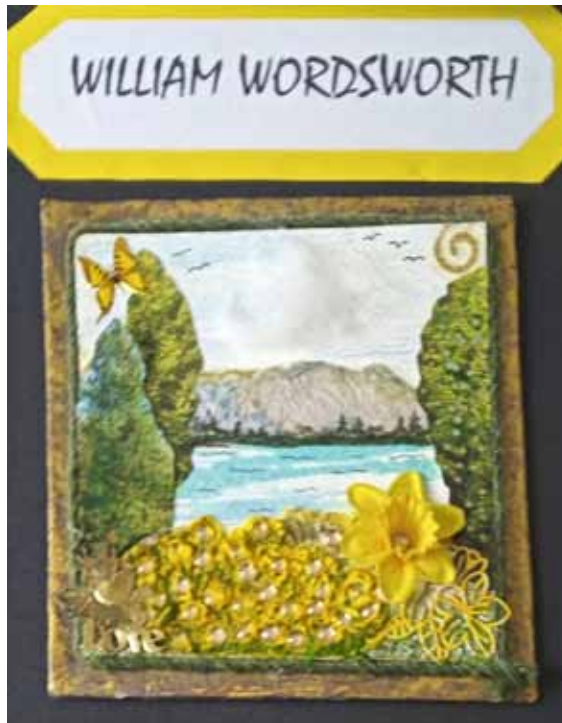

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Memorable Day at Silloth Dock Five Years Ago



The start of the year didn't live up to expectations for local ship spotters with arrivals coinciding with drab winter days. Rather than write an article around the resulting dull photos, this month features ships from five years ago when we enjoyed more traditional winter weather. On those bright crisp days photographers were much happier with the quality of their shots.

The first arrivals of that year were memorable for several reasons. It was one of those rare occasions when two ships arrived on the same tide. This required a local pilot on each ship and careful timing. There was only limited time when the dock gates could be kept open to complete the manoeuvre. The ships, KAPITAN SAKHAROV and STÖRTEBEKER, were both making their first visits to Silloth which attracted a good

turnout of ship spotters.

Having spent New Year at sea, the KAPITAN was first to dock and would be one of the last Russian ships to call at Silloth. As the ship passed by, crew stationed at the bow looked to be in high spirits as they chatted on the radio. Over the years, Russian ships have been frequent visitors to the port, often making long voyages from the far north of the Baltic Sea. Their names, written in Cyrillic script, have been a novelty for ship spotters and often a challenge to translate. The KAPITAN, registered in Arkhangelsk, commonly referred to as Archangel, was carrying a full load of fertiliser from Belgium.

Meanwhile, the second arrival was making her approach towards the dock entrance. Sea conditions were unusually calm allowing steady control of the ship.



STÖRTEBEKER had travelled the furthest of the two ships bringing wheat from the Baltic port of Vierow, a regular source of grain for Silloth. The ship was operated by a joint Finnish/German venture whose logos were seen on the funnel and wheelhouse. Not to be left out, Britain was included in the ship's credentials with a

port of registry of Gibraltar. The flag of the British overseas territory was flying proudly at the stern. One final observation; the ship is named after a legendary 14th-century pirate reported to have a liking for large portions of ale. All in all, it was a memorable day to wrap up warm and explore Silloth waterfront with a camera.
